#### San Xavier Road Pedestrian Bridge and Sidewalks Construction Project at the Santa Cruz River

The Bridge/Pathway project is currently on schedule. Workers are busy in the river bed this week drilling the pier shafts and completing the rebar cages for pier concrete. Shaft drilling will be on-going for at least the next 4 weeks. Along the pathway, grading is to be finished this week and concrete is to be poured next week for the pathway. This work will take at least 3 weeks. On the east side of the interstate asphalt taken out of the pedestrian island. This material will be removed by the end of the week or early next week.

San Xavier District monitors, managed by David Tenario in the SXD Natural Resources Department, continue to be employed on the site to safeguard any property or cultural resources. A vehicle was reported to the TOPD last week when it came down the river bed and exited through the project on the west end. The project access, on both sides of the river, is now being signed "Keep Out" and caution taped is stretched across the access at the end of each day's work. So far we have not had any additional reports of pedestrians walking through the project and into the river bed.

This is a dangerous construction site. Pedestrians should not enter the site nor should they cross the river bed. Pedestrians should continue to use the existing vehicular bridge for access until the project is completed and certified open. Any unauthorized vehicle entering the construction site or the river bed is doing so illegally and will be reported to the TOPD.

On the administrative side of the project, the contractors are having difficulty getting their sub-contractors approved through the TON TERO Office. I have offered to assist the contractor (Ashton) by contacting TERO to see what I might be able to do to speed up the approval process. Otherwise, sub-contracted job tasks do not have laborers to complete the tasks and this holds up other job tasks that would come after their completion.

The construction phase of this project is a joint effort between ADOT and the Ashton Construction Company but, If you have questions regarding this project please feel free to call me, Michael Bends, Planning Administrator for the SXD at 573-4071. In the meantime, PLEASE DRIVE CAREFULLY DURING THE CONSTRUCTION and DO NOT ENTER THE CONSTRUCTION SITE OR THE RIVER BED WITHOUT PERMISSION.

#### "Stranger Danger", tips and strategies.

Additionally, the following are important tips and strategies for children to protect themselves:

- Know your name, address, and phone number.
- Use the buddy system avoid walking anywhere alone.
- Trust your instincts if you feel you are being followed or something is not right, seek help immediately.
- If a stranger approaches you, you do not have to speak to him or her.
   Never approach a stranger in a motor vehicle. Just keep walking. Do not accept candy or any other items from a stranger. Never walk off with a stranger no matter what he or she tells you.
- If someone is following you try to remember the license plate of his or her vehicle and immediately tell a trusted adult.
- If a stranger grabs you, do everything you can to stop him or her from
  pulling you away or dragging you into his or her car. Drop to the ground,
  kick, hit, bite, and scream. Do whatever it takes to attract the attention of
  others who can help you. If someone is dragging you away, scream, "this
  is not my dad," or "this is not my mom."

The San Xavier District Ranger Department will be coordinating the Annual Bulky Waste Collection Event on March 27 & 28, 2015. The Ranger Department is looking to hire 8 laborers and 4 heavy equipment operators/drivers. The requirements for the 2 positions are:



#### Laborer

- Must be in good physical condition
- Must be able to perform heavy physical work in all types of weather
- Must follow safety standards and prevention.
- Must be on time to safety meeting and both working days
- 1<sup>st</sup> Aide and CPR a plus, but not required

#### Heavy Equipment Operator/Driver

- Must be in good physical condition
- Knowledge of hauling methods including heavy, bulky items and loose materials.
- Must observe all safety precautions to prevent injury to personnel or damage to vehicles and other property.
- Must have six months driving experience on construction projects.
- Must have current CDL (commercial driver's license)
- Must be on time to safety meeting and both working days
- 1st Aide and CPR a plus, but not required

DEPENDBILITY A PLUS!!!! We require all laborers to work both days and attend the safety meeting. Hardhats, safety vest, and gloves will be provided.

\*Consumption of alcohol or drugs or being under the influence of alcohol or drugs during working hours will not be tolerated. Suspicion that any employee is reporting to work under the influence of alcohol or any illegal substance will result in termination and being excluded from future District projects.

\*\*No gang attire, gang activities, or baggy clothing will be tolerated during your tempemployment status for San Xavier District.\*\*

\*\*\*No items collected during the Bulky Waste Event will be allowed to be taken for personal gain. \*\*

#### **Hazardous materials:**

consisting of paints, grease, oil, batteries, televisions, etc. please place in a separate pile for these items require to be disposed of properly. If you have a large amount of hazardous materials please give the Ranger Department a call so that special arrangements can be made to collect such materials.

Use caution around unknown hazardous material. DO NOT open or place with other bulky waste.

Bulky waste: such as wood, building materials, beds, mattress, old furniture are to be separated from the hazardous materials and appliances. Wa:k residents make sure you place items away from your home to ensure easy access to collect the waste.






