Hello Wa:k Community, I would like to introduce myself, my name is Cie'na Schlaefli and I am the new Natural Resources Specialist for the San Xavier District. I have had the opportunity to work in Wa:k since Fall 2011, when I started working for the San Xavier Cooperative Farm. I feel honored to be in a position to continue to serve the community now working for the District. Having been born and raised in Southern New Mexico, I understand the challenges that face us in the arid southwest. As your Natural Resource Specialist I will be focused on monitoring and preserving your water resources, helping implement the Range Management Plan, continuing the Mine Reclamation Program, and looking at other ways to support our natural systems for the wellbeing of the O'odham and the environment. SAWRSA: Our previous Hydrologist Scott Rogers is consulting with the District on a few projects that still need completion; one is the geophysical investigation work to locate future recovery wells for the proposed Coop Farm Extension project, another is the on-going mine and reclamation plan, and also training Cie'na on well readings and other field work. In March staff attended a Water Summit with the Allottee Association and Cooperative Association Boards and staff to review and discuss previous water summits, discussed Long-term storage credits, District's Water Management Plan, and the status of the Drought Contingency Plan.

We would like to acknowledge and extend a big "Thank You" to Archaeology Southwest for their presentation and site visit here at Wa:k on May 2<sup>nd</sup>. We had visitors from Colombia who were interested in our community's culture and heritage, as well as, our District departments and how we serve the community.




Here is the revised schedule for the summer youth Program:

# HOUSING DEPARTMENT

I also am a Cancer Navigator for Cancer Patients, in the near future I will be scheduling presentations in the community on various health topics.

My schedule here in Wa:k is Wednesday, Thursday, Friday 8am – 5pm, unless I have a training or meeting I need to attend. If you are not home I will leave a "Sorry I missed you" note with the time and date I attempted the home visit.

## **GREETINGS FROM THE LIBRARY!**


Well, we are extremely excited to begin our summer infant/ toddler program 2019.




This is a momentary enlightenment in the month of May. Ko'ok Maşad, "The Painful Moon" In the previous years from our early descendants. The raining season was late and the O'odham people lived entirely on wild foods without planting at all. When the foods ripened, during, or after the raining season wild foods would be gathered and stored to last throughout the year. This is just before the giant cactus harvest. During the month of May, the O'odham people would gather wild plants such as cholla buds (ceolim), dasylirion wheeleri (u:mug), fish hook cacti (jiawul), l'itoi Onion (siwol), and these are the natural foods for the month of May.
