Dear Wa:k Hemajkum,

As we enter the fourth month of corona virus (COVID-10) pandemic challenges, I want to remind you to **continue practicing safe distancing, wear a mask, wash your hands often and stay at home as much as possible**. These measures will keep you, your family and our community safe. The COVID-19 is real and has directly affected our community. Thank you to those of you who have been respectful to our community by practicing the above precautionary measures to keep us all safe.

The Tohono O'odham Police Department (TOPD) has been doing their best to deal with these challenges; however, you need to report these violations to them as soon as they happen, providing them with all the details you have at hand. You can call 911 and ask for TOPD and they will route you to their dispatcher.

We are grateful to the Tohono O'odham Nation for providing us with staple goods for us to package and distribute to you on a first come, first serve basis. We will again ask in the next distributions to allow those families who are most in need to pick up supplies during the first hour of the event.

Please continue to pray for those who have lost a loved one, and for those who are battling COVID-19. COVID-19 will eventually be extinguished by a vaccine and we must be patient in the meanwhile. We are living a very differential lifestyle than we have been in the past, and it's important for you to keep healthy, take care of your family members, and be grateful for all the good things in your life. We will get through this pandemic safely and be stronger in the end. Until then, be grateful for your health, your family, and all of Creator's blessings.

Executive Order

No. 2020-07

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the Chairman issued a Declaration of the Tohono O'odham Nation Proclaiming a State of Emergency in response to the nationwide spread of COVID-19, therein establishing the Unified Command to centralize all Nation's resources and efforts in response to the potential devastating effects of COVID-19 on the Nation; and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council passed Resolution No. 20-094 which, in part, authorizes the Chairman or Vice-Chairwoman to enforce quarantine orders, restrict the movement of people within the Nation, and prohibit gatherings of people in groups within the Nation and "require compliance with public health orders or directives issued by the State of Arizona or local governments that would not otherwise apply within the Nation"; and

WHEREAS, on June 17, 2020, Arizona Governor Doug Ducey issued the State of Arizona Executive Order #2020-40, *Containing the Spread of COVID-19, Continuing Arizona Mitigation Efforts*, which, in part, delegated authority to local governments to implement policies regarding face covering requirements in public spaces. Following the AZ Executive Order city mayors began implementing face covering requirements within each of their respective jurisdictions, including but not limited to the Arizona cities of Flagstaff, Phoenix, Scottsdale, Tucson, Tempe, and Tolleson; and

WHEREAS, by Executive Order No. 2020-05, the Chairman established new orders, in part, removing the Stay at Home Order, Executive Order No. 2020-03, and replaced the existing orders with modified social distancing guidelines, expanded social gathering numbers to 25 persons, adopted minimum requirements for Wakes and Funerals held on the Nation, and encouraged proper hygiene and social distancing practices; and

WHEREAS, in recent weeks COVID-19 cases in the state of Arizona have risen to exponential numbers largely due to reduced social distancing by individuals. The Nation is also seeing an increased number of cases linked to community spread, which has put the health and safety of Nation's members at heightened risk.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the authority vested in the Chairman of the Nation, the Chairman orders the amendment of Executive Order No. 2020-05, Section 4 and 5.

1. Section 4(a)-(f) shall be replaced in full with the following:
Effective June 5, 2020 at 6:00 AM, Executive Order No 2020-03, Stay at Home Order, shall expire. The following Social Distancing measures shall replace Stay at Home Orders within the exterior boundaries of the Tohono O'odham Nation:


- a. When leaving the home, physically distance yourself from others who do not reside in your household by maintaining a 6ft distance from others, when possible.
- b. With the exception of persons residing in the same household, all social gatherings are hereby prohibited until further notice.
- c. Individuals are *required* to wear face coverings in all public spaces where physical distancing is not possible.
 - i. "Public Spaces" means any place that is accessible by the general public (indoor and outdoor), including but not limited to: all governmental facilities, grocery stores, gas stations, convenience stores, post offices, establishments serving food or beverages, establishments offering recreational activities or entertainment and places that offer medical or health services or transportation to the general public.
 - ii. "Face masks or coverings" means cloth, fabric or other soft material that covers the nose and mouth. Coverings may be homemade or factory-made, or may be improvised from ordinary materials such as a scarf or bandana.
 - iii. *Limited Exceptions.* Face coverings are not required for children under the age of six (6); individuals who should not wear face coverings due to medical conditions, mental health conditions, or developmental disabilities; or first responders where face covering would interfere with their duties.
- d. Individuals should wash hands and/or use hand sanitizer regularly, avoid touching their face, and disinfect frequently touched surfaces regularly.
- e. Individuals are discouraged from unnecessary travel.
- f. Individuals who become ill and demonstrate signs and symptoms related to COVID-19 should remain out of the public, however, are encouraged to seek treatment and testing.

2. Section 5 shall be amended as follows:

Tribal enterprises and businesses, operating within the exterior boundaries of the Nation, are required to implement guidelines consistent with CDC Guidelines to protect the health and safety of employees and the general public, including implementation of face covering requirements for employees and customers/visitors at all time in public spaces.

All other sections of Executive Order No. 2020-05 and No. 2020-06 not inconsistent with this order shall remain in full force and effect until rescinded or amended by a subsequent Executive Order.

ORDERED this 23rd Day of June, 2020 in Sells, Arizona.

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT:

Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Virus (RHDV) Type 1 & 2

What is Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease?

- Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Virus (RHDV) is a highly contagious disease caused by a calicivirus that affects rabbits. Until 2020, it had not been known to affect any North American native rabbits or hares, such as cottontails, snowshoe hares and jackrabbits, however, now it has been confirmed in the 2020 Southwest outbreak in causing death in these wildlife species as well.

Symptoms may include:

- Loss of appetite
- Lethargy
- High Fever
- Seizures
- Bleeding from nose, mouth or rectum
- Difficulty breathing
- Sudden death.

RHDV is often a very swift and sudden killer, giving little warning. Rabbits may die without showing any symptoms at all. **Any sudden rabbit death is suspicious and should be reported to your veterinarian as a possible case of RHDV.**

- The incubation period for RHDV is 2-10 days, and RHDV2 is 3-9 days.
- The death rate of rabbits exposed to this virus is very high, between 40-100% for RHDV1 and 5-70% for RHDV2. Rabbits who survive are carriers and shed the virus for at least 42 days, perhaps longer.
- Some rabbits may have little to no symptoms of RHDV2 (subclinical), but may shed virus for up to 2 months.
- RHDV causes necrotizing hepatitis, and may cause necrosis of the spleen. There may be internal or externally visible blood hemorrhage. Death occurs from liver failure or hemorrhage due to an impairment in the blood's ability to clot.

How RHDV is Spread:

RHDV is highly contagious. It can be spread by:


- Contact of a rabbit with inanimate objects contaminated by the virus (i.e. fomites). These objects include clothing, shoes, and car and truck tires.
- Direct contact of a rabbit with an infected rabbit or the urine or feces of infected rabbit.
- Contact with rabbit products such as fur, meat, wool from infected rabbits.
- Insects (including flies, fleas, and mosquitos), birds, rodents, predators and other pets (cats and dogs) are known to spread the virus by acting as indirect hosts or fomites. They can transport the virus from an infected rabbit to a healthy rabbit.
- It's important to remember **RHDV2** does not pose a threat to **humans** or other animals, but is highly fatal in rabbits. It **can** be spread through contact with infected rabbits, as well as by materials having contact with infected animals. Again, this disease **does not affect** people or other animals.

The Wildlife and Vegetation Management Department asks all Tribal members to please report any deceased rabbits to include: cottontails and jackrabbits.

How to report:




