COVID cases are extremely high in our community and surrounding areas. The best way to stop the spread is to stay home. For the safety of our staff, effective August 26, 2021, San Xavier District staff will be working from home. The phones have been transferred to the manager's cell phones.

Elders will be checked on daily by phone and the at-risk elders will continue to receive services on Tuesdays and Thursdays, if needed. Please call our Senior Service Director if you have any questions or concerns, 520- 585-3241.

Due to the safety of our staff, we will not allow our staff in any homes that have any cold/flu symptoms, whether it's COVID or not.

We can overcome this if we all do our part. Stay home, avoid social gatherings, and follow the CDC safety guidelines. Be patient, pray, and think positively.

Natural Resources

Wa:k Community, Happy September to all! Enjoy the Labor Day weekend with all the greenery all around our village. We'll have to make time to do a little weeding around our homes that were brought on by the nice rains. Our staff presented our new fiscal year budget at the August 7th Community Meeting which included Natural Resources, Monitor Program, Rangers, and Community Cleanup Project. Once the District department budgets are approved by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council, we will look forward to continuing our services for the Wa:k Community in FY2022.

SAVING OUR NATURAL ENVIRONMENT

The land surrounding our community cemetery is getting pretty messy with all the trash built up there. As the time draws near to honor our loved ones let us consider taking care of the earth as well. The best option would be to please take a trash bag when visiting loved ones, or cleaning gravesites, and discard it in your trash bins. As the wind, sun, and rain bare down on the earth through the seasons, the plastic from the flowers and the foam from the wreaths become scattered in our washes and breaks down in our soils and hurts the plants and animals. Food for thought: there are natural, environmentally-friendly options like making wreaths bases from cardboard or thin green tree branches. Decorations can be made from natural items like devil's claw, gourds, vucca pods, dried flowers and plants. I am sure there are many other very creative ways we can save our environment for future generations.

MONITORS

AECOM inspected the I-19 northbound and southbound bridges over San Xavier Road, as well as the southbound on the ramp bridge to I-19. The inspectors looked for fatigue prone areas, checked if the structure is sagging, settling, or dropping, and inspected bridge columns. Putt Land Surveying set new corners for the GKW 5 Lot housing division on Go:k Ka:wulk Wo:g. Arcadis U.S. Inc. collected groundwater samples on Allotments #'s 266 & 267. TOUA conducted a survey for the Go:k Ka:wulk Wo:g Housing Project/1010-UI-18. The survey work located property corners and utility infrastructure for Lot #'s 1-12. We also had the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers conduct a site visit to inspect access roads associated with their monitor wells on Allotment #'s 266 & 267.

Hello Wa:k Elders,

I hope everyone is doing well. Please continue to wear masks, wash and sanitize hands for your own safety and the safety of your family members. Our community students are back in school, and we need to pay close attention if students become ill quarantine for 5 days and then call the S.X. Clinic to get tested at (520)-547-8140.

The Senior Services Department has been providing all services to our clients delivering meals, home health visits, transportation and medication pickup/delivery. These last few months we have been paying close attention to the Covid-19 Delta Variant cases developing in our surrounding areas. Due to the increase in numbers this has caused our department to make some changes to the way we will provide services to our clients. As of Thursday August 26, 2021, we will provide limited services this includes meals, home health visits, and transportation we will make phone calls to check on clients to make sure everyone is okay.

We will be picking up/delivering meds if you have meds to refill please utilize the automated system the number to call is 1-(8 77)606-9301 this helps us to better serve you in a safe way or you may call our Techs and put in your refill over the phone. If you are unsure how to work this system you can call our Techs to explain and help you understand. If you require in person assistance you will need to make an appointment to be seen in our office. Hello San Xavier Community.

This past month brought us some rain that we desperately needed. With that rain also brought leaky roofs. Your roof system is just like many parts of your home that require routine maintenance.

At least once a year you should do a walk around your home to check for any missing asphalt shingles or shingles that are lifting. Missing or loose shingles can become an area where water can enter the home. About every three years you want to reseal your roof penetration and repaint the pipes and vent cap that need to be touched up. Completing this routine maintenance will help your roof system stay intact which helps keep the water out.

On a side note, if you experience a plumbing leak in your home, please do your best to clean up the water and dry the area. When there is standing water left on the floor it will begin to damage the flooring system. This will add unnecessary cost to your repair.


