



Greetings Wa:k Community! We hope everyone had a nice Thanksgiving holiday with your loved ones. At this time, we are pleased to announce our new NRD Administrative Assistant, Ms. Eugenia P. The NRD staff have been involved with the following meetings or activities: 2 staff visited the Pima County Regional Wastewater Reclamation facility and the treated discharge area off Ina Road. The Natural Resources Specialist assisted Adrian Quijada & George Goode with the coordination of the Horseshoeing Training held at the SX Co-op. 2 staff assisted with and attended the 2nd Annual Women & Water - Planet Women Conference, we continued with our update meetings with Asarco & UKLA, and attended the annual SX Cooperative Association Allottee Meeting, staff discussed the SXD Adopt-A-Road Program with Administration, and attended the Universal Access to Clean Water for Tribal Communities webinar.

Wa:k Hikdan:

We had a couple of groups visit the Hikdan during this time of year. One group was the Southwest Inter-Tribal Knowledge Exchange group and the other was from Westminster University with the assistance of Dr. Jacelle Ramon-Sauberan. Both groups enjoyed seeing the Hikdan and complimented the Groundskeepers for the hard work they do and to the District for establishing the riparian areas for the community and future generations.

The Groundskeepers also completed the Advanced Smartscape: Plant Material course offered by the UA Pima County Cooperative Extension. This course helped the Groundskeepers further their understanding of plant morphology, which is useful in identifying plants in the landscape, and gain an understanding of specific plant species use. Good job everyone!

Recently, the Groundskeepers were maintaining the grounds at the Hikdan and came across an exploded firework. Although no damages were reported we would like to remind everyone that the discharge of any explosive devices is strictly prohibited at the Hikdan.




Cultural Group Facilitator James Funmaker
